Dear Parent/Guardian

The School Contributions and Charges financial procedure guides parents and carers to understand the flexibilities of the school fee structures and to determine the estimated total cost of their child's education for 2026, at the start of the year.

The Brookman Primary School Board has noted the schedule of Contributions and Charges for 2026.

The costs outlined are maximums that the school will not exceed for the year.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS 2026

Parents are asked to pay Contributions within the \$60 maximum set in the School Education Regulations (2000). The school needs your commitment to the Voluntary Contribution, as it is a major source of funding for the school and relies on all families contributing. Your contribution will be used to supplement school funding for the purchase of resources needed in the provision of the learning program activities including additional sporting equipment.

CHARGES FOR ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES 2026

Some additional activities that are part of an education program and which 'contributions' do not cover may incur an additional charge. All activities outlined overleaf are additional and if no payment is received, an alternative activity may be provided for your child. The School Board recognises the value of these types of activities and seeks to support teachers who coordinate them as part of their teaching programs.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Payment can be made at the school administration between 8.00 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. either by cash or EFTPOS. Direct deposit to the school bank account is also available. Please ensure if you are paying by direct deposit that you put a reference i.e. family name so we can easily identify who the payment is for.

EXTRA OPTIONAL ACTIVITIES CHARGES 2026

*The South Metropolitan Primary Extension and Challenge (PEAC) program provides extension and challenge opportunities for students deemed as eligible through state-wide testing in Year 4. Eligible Year 4 students have an opportunity to engage in an introductory event called 'Ignite' at a maximum cost of \$50. As students transition to Year 5 and 6, eligible PEAC students have the opportunity to engage in optional courses between \$15-100 per cycle (trimester). The **maximum** annual combined contribution, depending on course selections by parents and students is \$300.
